President's Report for the 2024/25 year

I would like to welcome you all here tonight to our 2025 AGM. I would like to start by thanking the Committee and Lisa for their continued hard work making sure the A&P runs successfully.

We had good numbers of entrants in most sections at the November show, even with the Wairapapa A&P Show being on the same weekend. Even with the rain late Saturday morning, we still had reasonable attendance and the inside stadium kept reasonably busy. Good feedback was received from many attendees.

Next event was The NZ Dairy Event. Firstly I would like to thank the new Chairperson, Hennie and his committee for organizing and running this event. Once again they have done a very good job and numbers to this event were again positive.

We are also hosted the Vintage Ag Expo in February. This turned out to be an extremely successful event and the organisers were extremely pleased with the number of entrants and public attendance.

There were a few other smaller well run events to add to the list which I thank also all those committee members and organisations.

Next year we will be hosting the Central District Poultry and Pigeon Clubs first National Event. We are pleased to be supporting their first National Show for this area.

Sub-committee Report to the Manawatu A&P 2025 Annual General Meeting

Dear Members,

On behalf of the New Zealand DairyEvent I'd like to report to the AGM on the event's past year.

The DairyEvent committee sincerely appreciates being able to run New Zealand's foremost national dairy cattle showing event under the umbrella of the Manawatu A&P. Even though the DairyEvent organisation maintains its own budget it is great to be able to use the A&P facilities, arrangements and administrative backup for the running of this show.

For the year ending on 31st of March 2025 the show was able to record a \$6,941.61 profit. The DairyEvent financial result is part of the overall financial results for the whole of the Manawatu A&P as reported to their 2025 AGM. With this in mind it is prudent that, over time, we keep track of the proceeds derived from the NZ DairyEvent, as it is vitally important to monitor the event's success (or lack thereof) over time. This past year the 3-day NZ DairyEvent attracted about 380 entries from the Jersey, Ayrshire, Holstein, Brown Swiss and Milking Shorthorn breeders. We've also had an extensive youth show with big classes of youngsters trying their hand at showing dairy cattle. We introduced scanning for the in-milk sections prior to the stock going into the ring to align with international best practice. The DairyEvent was livestreamed to a significant overseas audience with good numbers from Europe and North America tuning in to see top international judges sorting through the classes. We've also organised a sale in conjunction with sponsors PGG Wrightson, that averaged \$7,720/lot. A raffle was organised with the top prize of the pick from one of 5 top calves put forward by some of the nations top breeders covering the 5 breeds. The success of the raffle contributed considerably to the event's bottom line result. A workshop on show stock handling by one of the international judges was a roaring success. This was also the first year the DairyEvent had some trade sites from agri-businesses, something we hope to grow.

During the past year I was also invited to be part of the A&P liaising with Manfeild Stadium personnel, which I believe is a good opportunity to take stock and give the parties the opportunity to discuss any issues arising from the use of the Manfeild facility. In this regard there is the need to voice some concern regarding the maintenance of the Manfeild complex, some of which

has impacted on the DairyEvent committee's ability to present itself during the show (partitioning panels for sponsors and trade sides, moisture level of the pitch, state of repair of picket fences and manure bin set-up) and during the clean-up after the event (potholes in the carpark were making it more difficult to clean up bedding and feed leftovers resulting in some frustration from Manfeild staff about the time it took us to finish the job). These are not insurmountable issues and I have to appreciate Manfeild having its own financial KPI's to look after from time to time but, it is something that needs keeping an eye on over time and being part of the annual debrief with Manfeild staff, gives us the opportunity to discuss these matters. It also gives the DairyEvent (and the A&P for that matter) the chance to work with Manfeild on improving facilities over time as we're trying to improve the NZ DairyEvent experience and carry that out to a wider audience.

I'd like to express my sincere appreciation for the sponsors and grant funders of this year's DairyEvent, (a list of them is printed below). Their support enabled the organising committee to put on a professional dairy cattle show on a very modest budget, unrivalled in this part of the world and drawing international attention from having absolute top international judges that have, on several occasions, said that (to their own surprise) our stock is internationally competitive. We're still working on further improving the exposure of these sponsors, to optimise the leverage from their sponsorship investment and I believe that the DairyEvent and the Manawatu A&P should collaborate more on this where possible.

Let me finish with stating that the New Zealand DairyEvent would NOT have been possible without the work of its organising committee volunteer members, most of whom have taken significant time out of their own busy schedules to help organise the event. It is no mean feat and their efforts are not always recognised by outsiders but are very much appreciated.

Financial Report

All financial transactions have been accomplished by the Office Manager, with banking authorisations completed by the President, Vice President and one other Executive Member.

The year ending 29th Feb 2025 produced a \$17 743.45 loss, with \$8 577.49 of that being depreciation on Show Equipment. The availability of Grant funding was better this year, however qualification processes are becoming more stringent.

The Annual A&P Show came out with a Surplus of \$7544.58, even with the heavy rain on the Saturday, and The NZ DairyEvent in January of 2025 had a surplus of \$6,716.28.

Annual Review

Statutory audit and review requirements

Changes to the Charities Act 2005 created statutory audit and review requirements for medium and large registered charities. The current thresholds have come into effect from 1 January 2022 If your total operating expenditure for each of the previous two accounting periods was:

- over \$550,000 (medium) your financial statements must be either audited or reviewed by a qualified auditor
- over \$1.1 million (large) your financial statements must be audited by a qualified auditor. Charities that are required by statute to have an audit or review will also have their non-financial information (e.g. service performance reporting) audited or reviewed.

The Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association falls under the medium tier for the requirement to have the annual accounts reviewed.

Basis of Preparation*

Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association Inc has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)*

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less aggregate depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated using the maximum rates Historic rates are used to depreciate assets acquired on or before 31 March 2005 by Inland Revenue, and applicable rates after this date.

Differential Reporting:

The entity qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and there is no separation between the owners and the governing body. The entity has taken full advantage of all differential reporting exemptions.
