General Information for Exhibitors

Entry Fees: include the RAS Show levy of \$1.25 per entry, and are GST inclusive.

<u>Scratchings:</u> A 70% refund of entry fees will be given if scratching is made <u>in writing</u> at least 2 days before the beginning of the Show with a Vet Certificate or Medical Certificate.

No refunds will be paid out at the show (please do not ask), and no refund under \$10 will be paid.

<u>Prize Money</u> will be paid electronically after the show. Please ensure your <u>bank details are correct</u> on EvoEvents so that we can ensure your money is credited to your account.

Showing:

Ribbons to 4th place.

Prize money will be paid out as per the following:

1 – 2 entries: 1st prize money

3 - 4 entries: 1st & 2nd prize money

5 or more entries: 1st, 2nd 3rd prize money

Show Jumping & Show Hunter Classes prize money will be paid out as advertised in the schedule, thereafter 1:7 ratio.

By entering to compete at the Manawatu A&P Show, you are accepting and agreeing to abide by the Rules of the Royal Agricultural Society NZ and the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association. You are also indemnifying the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association (The Show) against damage(s) or injury occurring while you are on the showgrounds or its environs to participate in the Show, and The Show shall not be responsible for any loss or damage (inter alia) caused through disease or infection however arising. Each exhibitor shall be deemed to have guaranteed to the Manawatu A&P Association and have given warranty that to the best of their knowledge, each exhibit entered and brought to the showgrounds is free of any contagious or infectious disease.

You are required to comply with all Health & Safety Rules and requirements of Manfeild Park Trust and the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association, and to keep your exhibits under control at all times. Copies of the rules and policies are available from the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association office.

Parking:

Competitors' trucks or vehicles may only be parked in the designated parking areas or adjacent to the Ring Road, <u>not</u> on the grassed competition surfaces. Please help us to preserve our competition surfaces. (See Map prior to the Show for Parking and Gate access).

Please leave parking and camping areas clean and tidy. Use bins provided for dung and rubbish, or take home.

The truck parking area will be a shared space with loading and unloading of other animals on Saturday.

Breeds Performance Cards are currently the responsibility of the Breed Societies.

Replacement certificates (for lost certificates, change of horse/pony name etc), <u>must</u> be issued from the Royal Agricultural Society Head Office - <u>www.ras.org.nz</u> Note: The <u>outdoor arena is not to be used</u> during measuring

Entry to Manfield Park: via Gate 2 off Kawakawa Road.

Trophies:

Manawatu A&P retains all trophies and has them engraved each year. All trophies are available for photographs on the day but <u>must</u> then be returned to the stewards.

Horse accommodation:

Horse accommodation must be booked at the time of entering and paid with entry fees.

Stabling and yards are allocated on <u>first-come-first-served basis</u>. Please advise at the time of entry and booking of a stable/yard if a box is required for a stallion, colt, or broodmare with a foal at foot. Please leave all yards and boxes clean and tidy. <u>A cleaning fee of \$35 will be charged per box or yard left dirty.</u>

Horse accommodation charges:

Stables \$20.00 per night
Covered Yards \$17.00 per night
Uncovered/Open Yards \$12.00 per night

<u>Refunds</u> of accommodation paid will <u>not</u> be made unless withdrawals are notified in writing up to 48 hours prior to the commencement of the Show

Exhibitors must not occupy horse accommodation unless the allocation of same has been confirmed by the Yarding Steward.

OTHER ARRANGEMENTS

- There will be food and drinks available on the grounds throughout the show.
- Exhibitors must be neatly attired when entering judging rings with their exhibit.
- Breast plate number holders: Are compulsory for all showing classes except Working Hunters, Pleasure Horse/Pony classes, Donkeys and Mules
- Competitors are responsible for providing their own number(s) black numbers on a white background only please.
- Working Hunter Riders will be required to wear numbers on the left arm, which can be picked up from the showing caravan.
- **Arm numbers**: Any arm number issued will require a deposit of \$5.00, to be refunded on return.
- Informal turnout in all Unity Classes.
- **Unity classes:** Competitors will be judged together as a class with the following maximum points available:

Conformation & soundness	25
Turnout of horse, saddlery & costume	25
Paces & manners	25
Unity & riding	<u>25</u>
	100

RAS certificates (height/performance cards) must be available <u>in the ring</u> at the request of a steward. Failure to produce them will result in forfeiture of all awards and disqualification on the day.

- A **vet and farrier** will be on-call. Contact details will be advised.
- **Stallion badges, arm bands and vests** are available for purchase from the RAS Head Office. They will not be supplied by the show.
- Catalogues will not be printed, as all class lists are accessible online.

GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS

1. The Rules and Regulations as issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc.) for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows have been adopted by the Manawatu & West Coast A&P Association. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to be conversant with these rules. Copies of the Rules and Regulations are available on request.

The RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book is available for purchase from the RAS Head Office, or view on the RAS website.

- 2. **Entries are accepted on the clear understanding that the Rules will be adhered to.** (Please note Rules CDE 1. Re RAS Certificates & classification, GR4. Re Hard Hats and Safety Helmets, GR5.f) re Electronic and Audio equipment, and GR 6 re Abuse of Exhibits.
- 3. Hats and safety helmets: All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the grounds of an affiliated event. Hats/helmets must conform to one of the current approved safety standards. All hats/helmets that conform must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. Hat checking and tagging is available between 7.30 and 8.00am, and between 12.00 and 1.00pm each day of the show at the showing jumping caravan. All hats must be 'Yellow' tagged No tag, no start. Note: As from 1 August 2023 new standards where a 'yellow' tag must be wornhttps://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/

4. Arrears & Entries

The Committee reserves the right to limit or refuse any entries. If any entry is refused, entry fees will be refunded in full.

A person who is in arrears to this show with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or other fees, is ineligible to enter and compete at this show. Proof of payment is required before any restriction is lifted. Entry Refunds: Requests must be in writing, with Dr's or Vet's certificate, and will be less 30%. Entries must be done via evoevents.co.nz (online)

5 Clean Sport Testing (Forbidden Substance)

The RAS Clean Sport rules apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the risk of the person responsible. A Forbidden Substance is any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system of the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

- 6. The age of all horses and riders/handlers is as at August 1st 2025. <u>Horses/Ponies 3 years and under must not be ridden.</u>
- 7. All horses or ponies competing must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner, and all exhibits must be named at time of entry, which must be the same as the name on the RAS Certificate.
- 8. **Stallions & Colts** are eligible for all classes, but (with the exception of Miniature horses and foals) must be shown in a bit, and must be clearly identified with "S" identification badges, one on each side of their bridle at all times. The rider and handler must wear two RAS official armbands (one on each arm) at all times on the show grounds when leading or mounted, and must wear an approved Hi Viz vest during the show when outside of the showing ring. ('S' badges, arm bands and vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office). Open Pony Stallions must be ridden by a rider fourteen (14) or fifteen (15) or sixteen (16) years of age; led handlers must be fourteen (14) years and over. Stallions over 148cm must be led or ridden by a rider/handler 17 years of age or older.
- 9. All **leased horses** or ponies competing at this Show must be registered with the Royal Agricultural Society. Such lease must be for a term of not less than 6 months starting from receipt of confirmation of the lease from the RAS, and must be registered before entries are made.
- 10. Where classes are defined by height, the person responsible, or the rider, must carry a <u>current_RAS</u> Height/Performance Certificate or Life Certificate for their exhibit, and must produce it upon the request of a show official. Any competitor unable to produce a RAS Certificate is ineligible to compete and will forfeit any awards. The certificate must be completely and correctly filled in by the Measuring Official.

CDE 1 RAS CERTIFICATE & HORSE/PONY CLASSIFICATION:

Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS Certificate for their horse/pony, except a foal up to 6 months of age, at all RAS affiliated Shows/Events, and must produce it upon request to any authorised Show/Event personnel.

- 11. Depending on entries at closing date, classes may be cancelled, split, or combined if appropriate.
- 12. **Brood Mares:** Mare to have foal at foot or present veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date.
- 13. Before any prizes are awarded in **Entire Classes**, horses may be liable to examination by the Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Association. The decision of the Veterinary Surgeon shall be final and binding on all parties, and shall not be questioned by any Court. The entry of any exhibit in any of the classes affected will be deemed as acceptance of this clause.
- 14. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class, any or all such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the OC, Judges or Stewards. In all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit entered in more than one class must elect in which class they will compete.
- A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless the permission of the Chief Steward has been obtained; but when an owner has more than one pony/horse qualified for the same championship judging, a rider must be provided for each qualifier, and the Chief Steward advised. (Local Rule)
- 16. **A Novice** is a **Pony/Horse** or **Rider** that has had up to <u>five</u> wins at any A & P Show, in the section(s) entered, as at the day of the Show (Rule CDE 6).
 - After the sixth win, the pony/horse/rider is not eligible for Novice Classes. Novice ponies may be ridden by a rider of any age in novice classes; and may also enter open classes, ridden by a rider under 17 years of age. A novice champion may not compete in an Open Championship unless it has qualified through the open classes. The Height/Performance RAS Certificate <u>must</u> be presented on request in the ring, to be filled out and signed for each win. Winners failing to produce their card when requested will forfeit their awards on the day (Rule CDE 6.e).
- 17 Riders 12 years & over may enter both Saddle Horse and Saddle Pony Classes
- The Manawatu A&P Association is required to conform to the **Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments**; therefore you are required to carry out your work or undertaking on the Manfeild premises to comply with this Act. As a show exhibitor at this venue you are obligated to accept responsibility for ensuring a safe showing venue within the focus of the Act. As a user of these facilities, you are required to manage and supervise all your activities and live animal exhibits to ensure the good Health and Safety of all people involved in the show, at all times.
- All riders that fall in the competition arena, practice arena or elsewhere on the show grounds must be checked by the medic for Health and Safety reasons. This must occur before you continue to ride even if you have another equine in the same class. Medical fall cards will be issued to riders. (This includes showing sections)

Health & Safety Specific Requirements:

All vehicles, caravans and floats requiring power <u>must</u> have a Warrant of Electrical Fitness that meets the legislation standard AS/NZS 3001.

- Any and all electrical equipment, including extension power leads, must be <u>tested and tagged with a current tag.</u>
 (Standard AS/NZS3760)
- Vehicles and leads may be tested during the show, <u>on a strictly 'user pays' basis.</u> and must be pre-booked through the office.
- Anyone bringing in, or in charge of, the use of any motorized bike, two, three or four wheeled, must be trained in its use and must <u>always</u> wear a safety helmet when using it.

- As Manfeild Park is a public place, bike riders must have a current Driver's License.
- Quad bikes must not carry passengers, and no-one under the age of 16 is permitted to operate a quad bike.
- Motor bike riders must observe a speed limit of 20 k/p/hour at all times, anywhere on the showgrounds.
- 21. 'In-Line Resolution Process' Policy: This Show supports the RAS 'In-Line Resolution Process' Policy system. - 22. **The RAS Resolution Process** can be found on the RAS website, as above. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regard to a RAS official, the show will forward the matter on to the RAS CEO to handle it in the appropriate manner.

The Show will be issuing Fall Cards to Showing competitors who fall at our event. In the event of a fall, you will be required to seek assessment by <u>Pro-Med</u> services (on-site) before resuming competition. The stewards can assist with directions for Pro -Med.

This is now an RAS requirement to come in line with ESNZ rules

GENERAL CONDITIONS

SHOW PONIES, SADDLE HUNTER PONIES, WORKING HUNTER PONIES, LEAD REIN & FIRST RIDDEN PONIES General:

- 1 Riders in Open Pony classes must be under seventeen years of age. However, riders of any age (ie can be adults) may ride ponies in Novice classes only 2 Ponies three years and under shall not be ridden.
- 3 Ponies must be named at time of entry in all classes.
- 4 RAS Certificates must be produced on request of a steward.
- 5 Definition of a Novice: A Novice **exhibit or rider** is one that has **yet** to win six (6) classes in any division (e.g. conformation/paced & mannered/rider classes) within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event.
- 6 Pony Exhibitors also see Dry Mare & Gelding classes in Led Pony Section, and Welsh Section.
- 7 See 'Led Pony' section for 'Junior/Senior Handler' Classes.

HORSES

RAS height certificates are required.

Definition of a Novice: A Novice **exhibit or rider** is one that has **yet** to win six (6) classes in any division (e.g. conformation/paced & mannered/rider classes) within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event.

A horse entered in Novice classes may also enter Open classes.

Rider classes are based on age i.e. if a rider is under 17 years on the 1st August 2025 on a horse, they may compete in the 16 years & under rider class in the pony section. Horses three years of age and under shall not be ridden.
